Notes are provided at the end of each table describing how the federal program funds were identified.

These tables include federal programs that rely in whole or in part on Census Bureau data derived from the decennial census, primarily the American Community Survey and population estimates, and data produced by other federal agencies that are derived from such Census Bureau statistics. Examples of Census Bureau-derived statistics produced by other federal agencies include the Bureau of Economic Analysis' per capita income (which uses Census Bureau population estimates as the denominator and "long form"/ACS journey-to-work data to help calculate the numerator) and the Department of Housing and Urban Development's fair market rents, which is based on the Census Bureau's median household income.
